

GOLF COURSE UPDATE


Wow, it's hard to believe that the turf will be waking up from its winter nap shortly. This month we will be working on completing a lot of our winter projects. Some of these projects are: prepping equipment for the growing season, tree maintenance, bunker work, and root pruning. This

month we will also begin cart path work if the weather isn't too wet.

Please enter and exit bunkers on the lower sides to prevent sand from shifting off the steep slopes. As we enter our wet season watch and avoid all soggy areas and try to use the cart paths

when possible. We will rope or put signs in these areas to detour cart traffic. Remember to continue using sand and seed and return your bottles to the pro shop so they can be filled. Repair yours and one more ball mark on the greens. If the weather is cold call the maintenance shop or the pro shop to get a frost update. During a frost delay please ask someone in the pro shop if the practice green is clear of frost before practicing. If you have any questions or comments stop me on the course or call me at the maintenance facility.


