GOLF COURSE UPDATE

We are enjoying the cooler weather now which is great for golf and healing of the greens following aerification. The extended forecast is predicted to be a mild winter.

This winter we will be working on equipment maintenance, keeping the course clear of leaves, tree and stump maintenance, complete 14 bunker, and drainage.

We are working on placing a bench on 5 red tee complex. Tucker Keyes constructed the bench and Zach Anderson assisted with placing it next to the tee. We are waiting on the tee sign to be made but it will be there soon. We had a good year for the swimming pool and it is time that we let it rest for the winter. We have plans for some

improvements to the pool and surrounds for the 2023 season.

The cooler temperatures this fall will slow down the growth of the grass and eventually put it into a dormant state. At this time the top growth decreases but the rebuilding process in the roots begin to help build energy and store it for the plant to use during the high stress periods next year. Please scatter your carts during this time to avoid wear patterns in the turf. With the cooler temperatures along comes FROST! If you have questions when the course will open due to a frost delay please feel free to call the maintenance department. The pro shop will be updated as well. It is important to keep everyone off the turf when the plant is froze to

avoid internal cell damage. Any damage that occurs to the plant while its dormant will be visible until spring.

Remember to keep your carts at least thirty feet from the putting greens and use the cart paths whenever possible. Enter and exit bunkers on the lower sides to prevent sand from shifting off the steep slopes. Sand and seed bottles are at the pro shop. If you have any questions or comments please stop me on the course or call me at the maintenance facility.


OCTOBER 2022
